Title: Language of Racism and Nostalgia: Examining conversations related to the removal of Confederate symbols

Synopsis: The project investigates the language of online discussions about social change since the death of George Floyd, focusing on conversations related to the confederate flag and statues. To do this, 121 threads were identified on Reddit where users wrote comments discussing their opinions for and against the symbols. The thesis uses linguistic analysis such as topic modeling and parts of speech analysis to explore how opposing viewpoints on Confederate symbols are expressed linguistically. The goal of this project is to understand how communities discuss social change and whether or not there is a potential relationship between viewpoints on confederate symbols and attitudes towards race and racism.
